- b. Attendee survey results and comparison to previous surveys:
 - a. October 2009 Survey results (10/4/09-10/10/09) 75 total participants, 4.2 meetings per week avg attendance, 3.1 meetings per week avg attendance at the Chx Alano Club, 8.5 avg years clean, 49.5 avg age, 56 from Charlevoix County, 10 from Antrim County, 3 from Emmet, 2 from Oakland, 1 Ingham County, 1 New York state, 1 California, 1 no response. 4.8 avg score on the satisfaction rating on 0-5 scale where 5 is very important.
 - b. 40 comments were written in the "other services" section with highlights being 12 said great job, no other services needed; requests for more Alanon, NA, Alateen, more night meetings, more social activities, educational presentations, have more drop in hours, outdoor group activities, teach how to sponsor, drop in coffee hours from 4-5 pm, bowling team, more AA study meetings and one comment that we need to have Monday night football (umm, already going on?)
 - c. Comparison highlights from surveys completed in January 2009 and August 2008:
 - 1. Meeting attendance is on the incline weekly avg 3.4 in 2008, 3.7 in Jan 2009, 4.2 in Oct 2009.
 - Avg clean time declining indicating newer people sticking around – 10.5 years avg clean time in 2008, 8.5 years avg clean time in Oct 2009
 - 3. Average age is getting younger 52.9 in 2008 to 49.5 in October 2009
 - 4. Satisfaction ratings remain very high 4.7 avg in 2008, 4.8 in Jan 2009 and 4.8 in Oct 2009.

- a. New Advice to Parents: Tell the Truth About Your Past Drug Use The latest research from the Hazelden Foundation comes down firmly on the side of truthfulness when it comes to discussing drugs with kids. More than 90 percent of both parents and teens see parents as role models on drug-use issues, whether or not teens were aware of their parents past drug use. - b. AA Attendance and Abstinence Even those who connect with Alcoholics Anonymous meetings for a short while appear to benefit years later, though higher attendance was associated with a greater likelihood of long-term abstinence.
 - **Research Summary** While Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) is a preferred form of aftercare for patients "completing" formal treatment programs, little is known about AA involvement and its effects on abstinence over time. In this study, researchers assessed participation in AA, abstinence, and other alcohol outcomes over 5 years among 349 patients who entered treatment at baseline and attended AA at least once during follow-up.
 - i. Four patterns of AA attendance emerged: low (mainly during the year following treatment entry); medium (about 60 meetings per year with a slight increase by year 5); high (over 200 meetings per year with a slight decrease by year 5); and declining (almost 200 meetings the year following treatment entry and about 6 meetings in year 5).
 - ii. Abstinence (past 30 days) in year 5 significantly differed across groups: 79 percent of patients with high attendance reported abstinence, followed by 73 percent with medium attendance, 61 percent with declining attendance, and 43 percent with low attendance.
 - Patients with medium or high attendance had the largest social networks of people who supported patient abstinence or decreased alcohol use.
 - iv. Patients across the groups had similar numbers of dependence symptoms and social consequences of drinking. - Source: JoinTogether.org News 3/10/06
